Meeting called to order 4:30 PM
<u>GUEST SPEAKER</u>	<ul> <li>Exec D. Sherwood introduced George Bennett and asked him to talk about the RFP for aggregate mining.</li> <li>Potential aggregate producers have been asked to submit proposals to the Port Office no later than Feb 16, or postmarked by Feb 17, 2007. Exec D. Sherwood received a call from the DNR(Department of Natural Resources) saying they are back logged in getting the SEPA handled, and recommended the Port be the lead on the SEPA. Bennett said if the Port becomes the lead on the SEPA then it could be challenged. Bennett said that the Port does not have staff (like the DNR) to do environmental, drainage, traffic, wildlife and cultural reviews. Bennett wrote the environmental check list for the permit, and Klickitat County said "no" to being the lead in the SEPA. By WAC it defaults back to the DNR and Bennett recommended the DNR handle the SEPA. PC Vinyard said it is good that someone other that the Port is doing the SEPA.</li> <li>Bennett discussed production goals to be set aside for local supply. Bennett said language could be added to a lease to designate a number of tons for local supply. In order to increase the Port's cash flow, Bennett recommended the Port's lease set a minium and maximum production amount. Exec Dir Sherwood hoped to also spark interest in a operator who may also have an ancillary use, ie; construction company that makes preform tilt walls, etc.</li> </ul>	Exec Dir Sherwood will contact the DNR and let them know they are the lead in the SEPA

GUEST SPEAKER continued	PC Deo asked if the local supply parameters should have been set in the RFP. Bennett said you do not want to omuch in our RFP. You want to see which operators are interested and then negotiate with them to get the best deal for the Port. Bennett recommended that the Port require that they receive any data generated by the operators from any test holes. Bennett setimated there might be 4 million tons of material. He said there is also a fair amount of sand and that could also be marketed. Jim Riley gave comment on his experience with determining the amount of rock at the site. Riley said he has dug thirty-five feet down and has not hit any bedrock ledges. Jim Riley gave his opnion of large rock companies and how they are buying and leasing property in order to secure future rock resources so that they can sell their rock companies. PC Ford said the Port not looking for someone to put in a response only to just sit on the rock. PC Vinyard asked if the lease could have language stating a community rate. PC Vinyard does not want to see the Port incur costs to monitor a stock pile. Bennett suggested marking off an area to serve the local market. PC Deo said the key issue is that the Port does not deplete its own resource. Bennett talked about the minimum/maximum of royalties and the price per ton that the Port might receive. PC Vinyard wanted to ensure we verify the rate for rock and royalties is competitive. Jim Riley presented a letter to the Port Commission. Jim said he would like his company to stay right where they are for exit and for he port. Bennett said the Port can have more than one operator and is not going to submit a proposal to the Port. GUEST SPEAKER continued	Bennett explained how top soil needs to be stripped and stored so that it can be reapplied after the mining. Soil is required by the DNR so that vegetation can grow. Jim Riley stated that rock should be used instead of soil to prevent the spread of knapweed. Bennett said DNR requires soil be replaced as all slopes need to be reseeded.	
	PC Ford suggested that Riley Brothers enter into a month-to-month lease after their lease expires. PC Deo would like to see a 6 month to one year time frame. Jim Riley said he produces 25% of the concrete that is used in Klickitat County. Jim said they mine February to May each year.	
	Exec Dir. Sherwood said that she has received great interest from operators and they want to tour the site, but wanted the permission first. Jim Riley said that would be ok as long as they stay away from his equipment and he is informed of when they will be on site.	Port Counsel Wyers and Exec Dir

	Jim Riley said he won't stand in the Port's way to make a fair deal for the citizens of KC. Port Counsel Wyers thanked Jim Riley for his information tonight and for his spirit of community.	meeting.
COUNSEL'S REPORT	Port Counsel Wyers talked with the Port Commissioners regarding public comments. The public comment period of the meeting is an opportunity for people to speak their comments, there is no legal requirement that the port has to have a public comment period on the agenda. The public has a legal right to comment when the Port is adopting resolutions and budgets. The purpose of public comment is not to ask questions of the PC or to seek information from staff during a meeting.	
	Port Counsel Wyers stated a lease has been submitted to AmeriGas. There has been no response back from AmeriGas. Port Counsel Wyers sent an email today requesting proof of insurance. Port Counsel Wyers said a conditional use permit is required and he is not aware if AmeriGas has started the conditional use permit process.	
	Port Counsel Wyers and Exec Dir Sherwood have finished the details of ICE's draft lease. They are also working a draft lease with Verizon for antenna placement on the Port's DIP water tower.
