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AUDIT SUMMARY

Results in brief

In the areas we audited, Port operations complied with applicable requirements and provided adequate safeguarding of public resources. The Port also complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures in the areas we examined.

About the audit

This report contains the results of our independent accountability audit of Klickitat County Port District No. 1 from January 1, 2013 through December 31, 2015.

Management is responsible for ensuring compliance and adequate safeguarding of public resources from fraud, loss or abuse. This includes the design, implementation and maintenance of internal controls relevant to these objectives.

Our audit involved performing procedures to obtain evidence about the Port's uses of public resources, compliance with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures, and internal controls over such matters.

In keeping with general auditing practices, we do not examine every transaction, activity or area. Instead, the areas examined were those representing the highest risk of fraud, loss, abuse, or noncompliance. The following areas were examined during this audit period:

- Payroll
- Disbursements
- Accounting software controls

- Procurement
- Lease revenues
- Open public meeting minutes

INFORMATION ABOUT THE PORT

Klickitat County Port District No. 1 was formed in 1945. The District seeks to create long-term economic opportunities for local residents by encouraging the creation of diverse, stable employment, public and private capital investment, citizen involvement, and inter-agency coordination to encourage business recruitment, recreational development and quality of life.

An elected, three member Board of Commissioners governs the District and each Commissioner serves a six-year term. The District owns approximately 660 acres of property at Dallesport, on the Columbia River. The acreage consists of an industrial park, an aggregate mining operation, and a barge dock facility. Revenues at this site are generated from land/building leases, wharfage, dockage and the sale of water. Additionally, the District owns approximately 141 acres of property near Bingen, on the Columbia River.

Over the past several years, infrastructure has been placed on site in readiness for business park development. The acreage presently houses five industrial buildings, two parks, and a boat launch, as well as Bingen Lake and its surrounding wetlands. Presently, revenues at this site are generated mainly from land/building leases and property taxes.

The District has four full-time employees. The annual operating expense budgets for 2013, 2014, and 2015 were \$1.08 million, \$1.10 million and \$1.34 million, respectively, including debt service, infrastructure improvements and buildings. The Port's fiscal agent is the County Treasurer.
