RESOLUTION NO. 6-2018

A Resolution of the Port of Klickitat Commission
Establishing the Practicality of Alternative Fuels

WHEREAS, all vehicles and construction equipment owned and operated by local government subdivisions of the state must be powered by electricity or biofuel to the extent practicable pursuant to RCW 43.19.648; and

WHEREAS, the Port has reviewed the availability and cost of new vehicles and construction equipment using electricity or biofuel; and

WHEREAS, the Port has reviewed the ability and cost to convert existing vehicles and construction equipment to use electricity or biofuel; and

WHEREAS, the Port has reviewed the adequate presence of fueling facilities in its region of rural Washington State offering the retail sale of electricity or biofuel such that it meets the operational needs of the Port; and


WHEREAS, the Port has utilized the above information to evaluate the practicality of implementing the requirements of RCW 43.19.648;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Port Commission finds it is not practicable for all vehicles owned and operated by the Port to be powered by alternative fuels until such time as:

1. The number and location of vendors offering alternative fuels for retail sale is adequate to meet the operational needs of the Port; and
2. Vehicles that meet the operational needs of the Port (e.g. utility and pickup trucks) and utilize alternative fuels are available; or
3. The lifecycle cost of vehicles that meet the operational needs of the Port and utilize alternative fuels is less than, or equal to, that of vehicles the Port would otherwise procure.


